1.	Welcome and Apologies for absence:	
	The Chair opened the meeting.	
	Apologies were received and accepted from MSp, RP, and LWD. The meeting was quorate.

	The meeting was attended by representatives of the School Council.	
	School Council is used to help and uplevel the school to allow pupils to have their opinions heard. Each year, the School Council gets one representative per class. There are 14 members, including a Chair and a Secretary.	
	Challenge: A governor asked, how do you become a school council member?	
	Governors were advised that there is a voting system to self-nominate, with

ballots for each child per year group. The Chair wanted to be the Chair of the School Council for a chance to be a leader not a follower. The combined school council have celebrated many successful achievements throughout this year.

Another member of the School Council explained that the role of Secretary means they gets the chance to organise the meetings and write notes. There are many ballots for making decisions, which she also collates. Each start of term, a new register is created, and a register of attendance is recorded.

The School Council recently voted on upgrades to the outdoor playground equipment and are planning a reading corner for the KS1 playground. Governors were advised of the various fundraising events organised by the School Council.

Challenge: A governor asked, what year can you start being a School Council member?

From Year 1. If you get voted each year, you could be a member throughout the school.

Challenge: A governor asked, is it popular to be a School Council member? It is fairly popular, almost half the class nominated themselves to be a member.

Challenge: A governor asked, what has been your most significant achievement this year?

The painting of the container (of a muntjac) was great, it has really brightened up this area. The bake sale raised around £300. The KS1 Reading Corner is still being worked on but the work undertaken so far is a considerable achievement.

JG explained that combined with another pupil's fundraising, the School Council have raised over £600 for the Reading Corner in the KS1 playground.

JG advised the School Council that she is most proud of the Bake Sale. They organised it all on their own. There is also going to be a talent show planned for nearer towards the end of term.

Challenge: A governor asked, when do you meet?

Every Friday afternoon. A register is kept of attendance. This gives the Secretary an opportunity to check in on their wellbeing. Sometimes, members send a representative on their behalf.

Governors thanked the members of the School Council for attending.

Thanks to Jenny Tong and Helen Baxter, Ros Hill, Debs Hayward, and Alison Durston who are all leaving at the end of the school year. Combined, the school is ultimately losing over 65 years of school experience. The Headteacher wishes them well in their future activities.

New staff – Governors were advised of two new members of staff in Years 1 and 2.

Monitoring in terms of the SDP: data has come through, SATs data GPS 67%, reading 67.1%, maths 68.7%. These are below the national average. However, it looks like the children have made good progress. These results are not completely unexpected, there are quite a few children on the 99 mark, 1 below achieved. This data is not official and is subject to change. JG does not believe it is low enough to put a risk alert into Ofsted. Ofsted will have access to ASP, which considers progress made. Some children have done incredibly well.

Governors will review the data in the Autumn term. Phonics check results stand at 61%, this was discussed in the last Children's Committee. They learnt the long-term impact of Covid on the children's learning. There is also a lot of parental anxiety around child expectation which is also having considerable impact on children's learning.

Challenge: A governor asked, have you had lots of issues around resilience? There are a lot of people trying to get a diagnosis for their child, it has taken a significant part of the INCo's capacity to manage all the requests for additional support. Parental anxiety and over protection is filtering down to children.

Challenge: A governor asked if teachers are observing this culture of over protecting the children?

JG does think so. Teachers are talking more with senior leaders about how they can support these families. At the moment, staff are very tired. In terms of behaviour management, there is some great therapeutic work being evidenced throughout the school.

Challenge: A governor asked, is there a need for a piece of work around communicating to parents to help get their children ready for school? A governor was concerned that the transition day wasn't well attended. It seems that there is a culture for finding a diagnosis or a label to fit the child's behaviour. The SEND Offer is there to explore parental requests for assessment.

Growth Mindset is taught at every opportunity throughout the school day, the children are the most successful method of getting the message home.

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	Challenge: A governor referred to the Head's use of the phrase "Covid tsunami" in her verbal update. Do you think the school has been more impacted by the pandemic or the fact that the children started with a low baseline? JG explained that the consolidation of environmental factors has impacted the children. It's not just the pandemic. Governors noted the influx of new children to school which may have skewed the data slightly. Greater analysis of the data will highlight this at a future Children's Committee meeting.
