The purpose of this letter is to give you important information about the term ahead. You will find details about home learning, reading books and general information about how a typical week will look. A copy of the letter and other information will be posted on the school website. Exciting things the children will be learning in the Spring term...

Our topic this term will be 'Magnificent Mayans'.

One of the school's themes is farming and so we shall be establishing how the Mayans farmed and comparing this to the Ancient Egyptians and more modern farming that the children would have studied in previous years. We shall also be exploring some of the Mayan's religion, their role in chocolate and what technology they used which is still used today in some form.

In Science we will be investigating properties of materials taking in the differences between reversible and irreversible changes and their importance in everyday life. In RE, we will be answering two key questions: What does it mean to be a Buddhist and can we all be enlightened and What did Jesus do to save human beings. In PSHE, we will be looking at how to work together and financial capability. We shall also be exploring a unit on Relationship and Sex Education. In Computing, we will be understanding how to create and used spreadsheets before moving onto coding using Scratch. In PE, the children will be completing a group sequence in gymnastics before doing a dance unit based around our Mayan topic. For our outdoor sessions, we shall be completing a unit on Tag Rugby and Tennis. In Art, we will be working with clay to create a Mayan sculpture. In D&T, we will be making electrical fan buggies. <u>PE</u>

Pandas & Tree Kangaroos - Mondays and Thursdays

Children should have a PE kit consisting of a house colour T-shirt without buttons, dark plain shorts, jogging bottoms, a jumper and a change of shoes for outdoors. No jewellery should be worn during Physical Education lessons including swimming. It is also not safe to cover earrings / studs / sleepers with tape. If children wear earrings to school, they need to be able to remove them themselves for PE lessons. If your child is unable to do so, earrings should be removed before coming to school. We advise that if you are going to allow your child to have their ears pierced, that this is done at the start of the summer holidays so that their PE entitlement is not compromised.

We ask that all PE kits are kept in a drawstring bag and are left in school. We send home PE kits at the end of each half term for washing during holiday time. **PLEASE LABEL EVERYTHING!**

As per the weekly letters over the last few weeks, please can you ensure that children have a change of shoes so that they are fully able to participate in PE. When deemed safe, the children will be using the field for PE and boots/school shoes will bring the mud in and are also not appropriate for participating fully in a PE lesson.

HOME LEARNING

This year we would like all children to focus on reading for their home learning. There are so many ways that you could do this such as sharing a book together or reading to your child. In our experience, many children tend to lose some of their good reading habits during time away from school and this can set back their progress. As we need to be able to read to access nearly all other subjects, we really want all our children to retain the skills they have worked so hard to achieve this year. If you would like to see which books have Accelerated Reader quizzes, you can check using this website. They can then quiz these on their return to school.

You will have also seen a letter detailing the strategies we use for the four main mathematical operations. If you wanted to complete any examples over the Christmas period or beyond, it is always good to keep these skills bubbling over in the background while we learn new concepts in class.

Spelling shed is still accessible as well to recap and overlearn spellings and spelling rules that we've covered this year so far. Alongside the letter above, the Year 5/6 spelling words have been attached. These are not to be learnt by wrote but give an idea of the calibre of words expected within the year group.

!Jewellery!

Please can all additional jewellery be left at home. There have been several children wearing necklaces be that in plain sight or underneath clothes – please can these be kept at home thus reducing the risk of necklaces being caught in class/corridors or lost in school especially if they hold sentimental value.

We are continuing to have a difficult time with hooped earrings being worn by some children – can we insist that children wear just studded earrings reducing the risk of earrings being caught accidentally in class/corridors.

Acrylic nails have also made the odd appearance which aren't probably the most appropriate for school use given some of the subjects we cover during the week.
