Musical Palindromes	Performance
Turn music into a palindrome Improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related elements of music Play and perform in ensembles, playing instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression Turn the musical piece into a palindrome, write the structure	Perform and record animal music Play and perform in ensembles, playing instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression Bring all ideas together and perform the piece Record each piece of music
Turn the musical piece into a palindrome, write the structure Vocabulary	

A motif	a very short musical 'idea' – often just a small group of notes or a rhythm
a palindrome	something that is the same forwards as it is backwards
retrograde	a 'posh' word for backwards, often used in music
Musical structure	How the music is built
