Dear Parents and Carers,

In English, the children have been learning about the poet, Benjamin Zephaniah. They studied his life and the causes that inspired his poetry. They also had a go at performing one of his poems, Talking Turkeys. They had great fun creating a performance, using a variety of intonation, expression and actions to make their performance interesting to the audience. They also had a go at writing their own poem inspired by Benjamin Zephaniah's poem, People Need People. In science they continued to investigate what makes a balance meal and why the body needs a variety of different foods to keep it healthy, they then thought about how they could create their own balanced meal. In Geography, they learned about climates and how different areas of the world have different climates and they looked at the animals that are adapted to living in these different climates.

Reminder: Tuesday 13th February will be the last forest school of this half term. Please make sure your child has a change of shoes.

Home Learning: Reading is the key focus of the school and daily reading with and to your children will benefit their learning and understanding of all areas of the curriculum. All the children have been given a log in to Collins Big Cat and books to read will be set on there. Please note that sometimes it seems take a couple of attempts to successfully log on, however, if you have difficulties logging on, please contact your child's class teacher, their email is on this letter. There will also be a sheet of activities on Teams to complete if your children would like to add to their learning and their work can be uploaded back onto Teams to share with the class. Activities will also be set on Mathletics.

Next week in **Maths**, they children will be consolidating the different methods they have learned for multiplying and dividing.

They will also continue to work on learning the 8 times table.

Next week in **Art**, the children will be working on an art project inspired by Alberto Giacometti, the Swiss sculptor. They will be creating their own sculptures based on the human form.

Spellings will be focusing on words ending in the suffix '-le'.
