Head teacher's message



Message from me

As I move towards my last term as Head teacher here at Waterbeach Primary School, I know how important it is for the children and staff to get to know the person who is going to take over in my role in September. Mr Neil Lloyd will be coming in to school occasionally, in the summer term, in order to meet everyone and to complete some hand over sessions. I will also be working with him during the Easter break in order to share key documents and strategies that are the school's main focus. He is looking forward to joining the school and meeting everyone and will be arranging opportunities to meet with parents in the Autumn term.

Fond farewells and happy hellos.

As we say "goodbye" and "good luck" to Ms Laws as she leaves to start her maternity leave, we say "hello and welcome" to Mrs Edwards who will be teaching the Sea Turtles for the summer and autumn terms. She is not the same Mrs Edwards who is currently working in Sea Turtles, so the children will not have to learn a new name.

We are also saying a sad "goodbye" to Ms Barks who has been with us since her final teaching practice ten years ago. Everyone wishes her all the very best for the future and hopefully she will keep in touch to let us know how she is getting on. Ms Spratt will be taking over in Gorillas class until the summer holidays and we look forward to welcoming her to the team.

Attendance and illnesses- an update.

This term has been very short but busy. There has been a high level of staff and pupil illnesses across the school this term and we have increased the amount of deep cleans and reinstated the hand sanitising regime. However, with 520 children in school alongside nearly 90 adults everyday - it is very difficult not to spread these stubborn viruses once they find their way into the building. We try to warn parents if we feel there is a building pattern of a certain illness but it is not realistic to expect school to let everyone know of each specific illness unless it is statutory.

To help us manage this, please can you support our drive to keep these viruses at a minimum. Something as small as making sure children keep their hands clean, especially after they have been to the toilet, will really help.

There is a lot of government focus on school attendance at the moment and we have a very clear policy and monitoring system to track children's absence. However, we also understand that if a child is ill they should not come into school, this will only make the illnesses spread more rapidly. I know that it is a true dilemma for parents - "Are they well enough to go to school or not?".

School usually takes action when there is a pattern of absence where children are consistently off school for minor ailments/ unexplained reasons. Sometimes we see a pattern where children can be absent every Friday or Monday. We understand if your child has had a terrible bug or needs a variety of medical appointments and, of course, this absence will be authorised. Sometimes, I invite parents in to discuss this because it is easier than the usual letters that are sent out. However, there are instances of children having attendance as low as 70% because of days where they have not come into school for reasons not related to illnesses and or with no reason at all.

Fundamentally, it needs to be understood that school has a legal duty to ensure children on roll are both safe and receiving an education. For the vast majority of our families I know that this is also their priority and am grateful for this. Thank you.

Eco Council - good work

A huge "shout out" from me to the children who are leading this project for our bid to get the Eco Schools flag. They are planning on holding a presentation on Thursday 25th at 2.30pm in the hall. It will be on a first come first served basis - so please do not be offended if we have to turn people away.
