## Curriculum Capture for Year 1

### Religious Education: Living in Harmony

#### Key Knowledge and Beliefs

##### What is caring and what does it feel like?

We have people around us that care for us and we care about other people as well. Caring for someone or being cared for can help someone feel happy. Care can be shown in lots of different ways, such as helping a new person at school or when someone feels unwell. There are lots of examples in stories of caring.

##### What do Christian stories teach us about caring?

Christians believe help should be done out of compassion and not for reward. Everyone is worthy of help, even enemies.

Children will listen to the story '**The Good Samaritan**'.

It explains to Christians that help should be given to anyone that needs it.



##### What do Jewish stories teach us about caring?

Jews believe in showing care through the sharing of food with others on special days.

Children will listen to the song '**Two Candles**' that is played when Jewish people celebrate Shabbat/Sabbath rest and make time for each other on this day to show they care.



##### What do Sikh stories teach us about caring?

Sikhs believe giving help to others in practical ways is central to being a Sikh.

Children will listen to the story about **Bhai Ghanaiya**, who gave help to everyone, including enemies. He was given extra aid by his leader, **Guru Gobind Singh**, to show how he was caring about everyone, including his enemies.

##### What do Islamic stories teach us about caring?

Muslims believe in the tradition of '**Waqf**' the tradition of giving Allah a piece of land that will benefit others forever.

Children will listen to a story about a character called **Umar Ibn Al Khattab** who inherited a piece of land. On the advice of the prophet Mahammad, he donates any money made from his land to help travellers, set free slaves and give gifts to poor people.

##### What have we learned about caring?

Thinking about the stories from different religions about caring, the children will discuss how caring looks similar or different and what imagery could be used to show what caring means.



#### Vocabulary

<b>Bhai Ghanaiya</b>	He was known for pouring water for all the wounded members of the battlefield no matter whether they were Sikhs or fighting against them
<b>Guru Gobind Singh</b>	He was the last of the ten Gurus and introduced many of the customs that Sikhs practise today.
<b>Prophet Muhammad</b>	Believed to be the founder of Islam and God's messenger.
<b>The Good Samaritan</b>	Tells the story of a man traveling who is robbed of everything he had and is finally helped by a good Samaritan, who does not care who he is.
