Number knowledge poster.

Pick a number less than 1,000,000 Can you make a poster to show everything you know about it? What are its factors? What are its multiples? Is it a cube or square number? When might we see this number in real life? If it was an amount of money, what could you buy with it? Is it prime? What number sentences can you create that equal your number? The more ambitious the better!

Class Animals: Can you draw, paint or create a model of your class animal? Could you research the animal and make a fact file, poster or presentation about it?

Could you research why it is endangered and what people are doing to help? What charities support the animal and could we have a fundraiser in class to help?

Make your own music.

Make drums with sticks. Fill bottles with water and see how the sounds change. Check the ‘Music and Sound’ section of the tools in Purple Mash for some online music makers.



Write a letter to school or your new class teacher to tell us about your holiday. You can put it in your book or post it to school!
